- Increase accessibility for multi-cultural, including Aboriginal, and multi-linguistic participation
- Ensure the safety of every participant

What is your responsibility?

It is important that if you see something you say something – if you receive a report or believe that you have observed any indicators of child abuse at the venue participating in one of our programs, casually or in an event, please let your SSA representative know immediately so they can raise all concerns through the appropriate reporting lines.
